MINUTES OF THE BUCKSKIN FIRE DEPARTMENT DISTRICT FIRE BOARD

03/13/19-Open Meeting: Minutes to be approved at open public meeting on Wednesday, March 13, 2019. 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Chief's Monthly Report - February

Troy Maloney, Fire Chief

As this is written on March 4th, additional updates will be provided at the next Board meeting.

<u>Personnel</u>: Lieutenant Weatherford covered while Chief Maloney was out of the office from March 5th through the 10th. When a Captain or Lieutenant covers for the Fire Chief, their primary function and responsibility is to respond to major emergency incidents to assisted with scene management. They will also work to solve other managerial issues that may arise. All other personnel are doing well.

Lieutenants Foerstner and Fernandes attended a National Fire Academy class on Initial Fire Attack for Company Officers.

Firefighter Maxwell taught a CPR class to the State of Arizona Wildland Firefighters from our region. This is a Hotshot type hand crew of 20 firefighters.

Please welcome our new Paid On-Call (POC) Firefighter/EMT, Chase Rather. He has successfully completed all the steps necessary to become part of our team.

Apparatus: Boat-1 is back in service.

Command-11 (Chevy Colorado) is in service.

1152 (Ford F-150) is being prepared for sale on the government surplus website as directed by the Board.

<u>Facilities</u>: We are continuing to make repairs to station 11, starting off with electrical hazards and roofing repairs.

<u>Incidents</u>: (the incidents listed below are only the calls for service that stood out from the normal call volume/types)

At 2:46 PM today, Tanker-1131 and Chief-1100 responded to assist the Bouse Fire District with multiple structures burning. Fire units from Parker, Quartzite, Salome and Ehrenberg also responded. Several mobile homes and out buildings were lost. No reported injuries. The cause of the fire is under investigation.

Sunday, the 25th at 7:25 PM, Engine-211, Engine-11 and Chief-11 responded to a headon accident on Hwy-95 north of the Bill Williams bridge. E-211 arrived to find two vehicles involved with four minor injuries. Vehicles were blocking all lanes of Hwy-95. While en-route, E-11 and C-11 were diverted to a seconded accident on the Bill Williams bridge involving a La Paz County Sheriff officer. C-11 and E-11 arrived to find a single vehicle rollover with extreme damage. The officer had moderate injuries and was treated by E-11 and ground transported to Havasu by AMR. The highway was shut down for a couple hours while Arizona State Troopers investigated the accident.

Wednesday, the 27th at 2:27 PM, Engine-11 and Engine-211 responded to a medical emergency. This incident turned out to be a very serious life-threatening incident that required the patient to be flown out on a medical helicopter. Chief-11 responded to coordinate the landing and takeoff of the helicopter. We landed the helicopter in the middle of Golf Course Road with assistance from the La Paz County Sheriff.

Thursday, the 28th at 2:12 PM, Boat-1 responded to assist the La Paz County Sheriff Office on a sunken boat near Rock Island. No injuries were reported.

Thursday, the 28th at 4:12 PM, Engine-11 and Chief-11 responded to an elderly victim stuck on a steep hillside approximately one mile east of 94th Street. The victim had been stuck on the hillside for approximately two hours before being seen by family members who were searching for the victim. Access to the area near the victim was made via four-wheel drive (Command-11) where the crew from E-11 hiked approximately a quarter mile up a hillside to the victim who had fallen and slid down the steep hill. The victim was refusing treatment and was assisted by BFD personnel back up the hill and extricated by a UTV.

We are in contact with the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) for the advisement of road closures effected by the Hwy-95 work being completed. At times, Golf Course Road or Resort road will be closed to all traffic including emergent vehicles. The project will continue into early June.

<u>Administration</u>: We are working on reviewing and updating Standard Operating Guidelines (SOGs). SOGs apply to day to day operations/response of fire crews and are approved/revised by the fire chief.

We are working of development of a draft budget and Capital Improvement Depreciation Scale for FY 19/20.

We have found that Resolution 2015-1 (billing non-residents for services) was adopted by the Fire Board in 2015, but the Fire Board never formally adopted the fee schedule they had developed. Because of this, we will be requested the Fire Board to re-adopt the resolution which will include the fee schedule. I have researched the market pricing for services and found that the fee schedule pricing is appropriate.

We are in need to replace the Chase debit card system we use for Wildland deployment expenses with Chase credit cards. Debit cards hold a cash value and are not permitted for use in governmental agencies. This was an oversight on the behalf of Chase Bank when the original debit cards were issued. The change will require a Resolution adopted by the Fire Board. The proposed resolution will be included in your upcoming Board packet.

We were awarded an AZODHS grant for \$1500 to purchase a wheeled rescue cart.


We qualified to receive free smoke detectors from the American Red Cross for installation in homes as well as RVs. This program has absolutely no cost to the District, nor the occupants. All we have to do is complete a tracking form for each installation and fax it to the Red Cross for their records.
