No bids had been finalized at the time of this meeting.*

(Discussion): Scheduling of a special meeting with Parker Fire Board for discussions regarding possible consolidation of Parker Fire into Buckskin Fire District. *Discussion between Board Members and Chief Maloney regarding consolidation, what is involved, economic values for both organizations and to have a special meeting set up for a workshop at the next meeting in August. Chief Maloney had a printed power point presentation that was given to the Board, explaining how cooperative and shared services advantages. The Board heard from several Parker firefighters regarding consolidation and their opinions of change. All of them that attended the meeting were in favor of the consolidation of Parker Fire into the Buckskin Fire District, they spoke of better leadership and organizational growth.*

## Chief's Monthly Report - June 2019

Troy Maloney, Fire Chief

Personnel: All are doing well. We have one employee out on Workers Comp from a knee sprain (different employee then the last work place injury).

Apparatus: June 11<sup>th</sup>, confirmed with Arizona State Parks Director Bob Broscheid that the State did fund \$225,000 to replace our fire/rescue boat. The funds will be available to us July, 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019. We are working with the State on the process and timeline.

Boat-1 is currently at Conquest having the damages assed for our insurance adjuster. Conquest awaiting approval for repairs from our insurance company (VFIS). The repairs are totaling \$75,000 to \$90,000.

We are receiving bids on the new boat from Conquest, Nordic and Munson. We have been working with the State of Arizona procurement office on the funding. We will be required to sign a Fire Board approved Inter-Governmental Agreement (IGA) with the State to receive payment.

June 21<sup>st</sup>, a nationally certified Emergency Vehicle Technician (EVT) from Quality Fleet Solutions was on site performing annual Arizona Department Transportation (ADOT) vehicle and National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) safety inspections of our fire apparatus. Quality Fleet Solutions competed their NFPA & ADOT inspections of our apparatus to find our fleet in pretty good shape. There are several repairs that we will need to addressed, but nothing major.

E-1101 was out of service for maintenance and repairs at Lowey's in Havasu. Crews operated out of the reserve engine (E-1103). E-1101 is back in service.

Facilities: We are continuing to make station repairs as finances allow.

Incidents: May 31<sup>st</sup> at 18:37 hours, Boat-1, Parker Fire, CRIT Fire & Police and the La Paz County Sheriffs responded to a reported drowning in front of the Blue Water Casino near the dam buoys. E-1102 moved up to area-1 cover coverage. Boat-1 was first on scene and confirmed a drowning per witnesses. Boat-1 divers initiated a dive-recuse search along with Parker Fire divers and La Paz County Sheriff divers; no victim found after over an hour of searching and the rescue efforts were called off. The scene was turned over to CRIT PD for body recovery.

June 1st, Boat-1 and BFD divers assisted the La Paz County Sheriff's dive team on a recovery search for the missing person from the day before; no body found and efforts were called off.

June 7, briefed with San Bernardino Fire Department fire boat crew along with the crew from the US Coast Guard boat crew. Both agencies requested familiarization tours of the river for their boat operations. Lieutenant Weatherford rode with the Coast Guard and I rode with San Bernardino FD to discuss the hazards of this stretch of the river in preparation for the Tube Float.

We had extra crews on duty for the 2019 Parker Tube Float. Parker Fire assisted us with manpower and an engine. San Bernardino County Fire and the US Coast Guard provided rescue boats to assist us with the Tube Float. There was a a very large law enforcement presence on the water and on Riverside Drive.

June 8<sup>th</sup>, the 2019 Parker Tube Float went off without any issues on our end. We had an amazing inter-agency operation that went very smoothly. The assistance we received from other agencies was impressive. We ran 15 responses from 08:00 on Saturday to 08:00 on Sunday. Of those, only eight were contributed to the Tube Float. This event was well organized by the Chamber of Commerce.

June 9<sup>th</sup> at 18:00 hours, Boat-1, E-1102 and C-1100 responded with the La Paz County Sheriffs for the report of explosive devices at Castle Rock Shores Resort. Several "1/4 sticks" of dynamite was found duct taped to rocks in the water. The Sheriff's divers dove to clear the area of anymore. BFD units stood by to back-up the divers and in case of a detonation; none occurred.



June 12<sup>th</sup> at 15:38 hours, E-1101 and C-1100 responded mutual aid to San Bernardino Fire for a structure fire in Big River. An engine from CRIT Fire also responded along with an engine and water tender from Parker Fire. Units arrived to find an approximately 1500 square foot pole barn type structure fully involved with an exposure to a single-family residence. The fire was extinguished by units on scene with minimal damage to the residence. The fire was caused by the owner/occupant welding on a vehicle. The scene was left with San Bernardino Fire. All other units cleared at approximately 17:00 hours.

June 14<sup>th</sup> at 14:07 hours Boat-1 responded to a boat fire just up river of the Blue Water Resort buoys. Boat-1 arrived on scene to find a well involved boat on fire a drift. Boat-1 started to extinguish the fire when water started to rapidly fill the haul of Boat-1. Lieutenant Fernandes what the boat operator and he immediately shut down fire pumping operations and quickly took the boat directly to shore where it sunk in approximately 10' of water. The Boat-1 crew and members of CRIT Fire were able to offload most all of our medical equipment safely. C-1100 arrived on scene and contacted a salvage company out of Lake Havasu City and contacted our insurance company (VFIS).

La Paz County Sheriffs were on scene and took a report. Absorption booms were quickly put into the water to limit possible contamination. The boat was salvaged via an air bag system from the salvage company and towed to the Blue Water Resort boat ramp where it was loaded onto our trailer and towed back to station-11. No one was injured in the event and the original boat that was on fire drifted into the reeds on the California side where it burned up and sank. The La Paz County Sheriff has loaned us a boat to use for rescue responses. However, it does not have any fire suppression capabilities.

June 18<sup>th</sup>, 30 bicyclists with Journey of Hope were welcomed at BFD Station 11 to swim in the river and take showers in the fire station after riding from 29 Palms in California to Parker, Arizona.

June 19<sup>th</sup>, the 30 bicyclists with Journey of Hope road to BFD Station 211 were the Firefighters Association and on-duty crews cooked them breakfast. The cost of this event was donated by our Firefighters Association.

*In 1987, one man's dream of riding his bike across the country came true. What he did not know was the inspiration and motivation his trek across America would give to The Ability Experience. The very next year, his ride inspired The Ability Experience to create the largest fraternal fundraising and awareness event of its kind, the Journey of Hope. Today the Journey of Hope covers 32 different states, cycling over 12,000 miles combined, it is solely comprised of members of Pi Kappa*

*Phi and continues to spread a message of acceptance and understanding for people with disabilities.*

June 24<sup>th</sup> at 15:10 hours, E-1102, E-1101 and C-1100 responded to boating accident at Havasu Springs Resort. E-1102 arrived to find a single victim from a personal watercraft accident still in the water at the docks in front of the main restaurant. The patient was removed from the water with assistance from E-1101 and C-1100 and patient care provided by BFD Paramedics. AMR for transported to Havasu Regional Hospital.

June 28<sup>th</sup> at 01:12 hours, E-1101, C-1100 and Parker FD responded to structure fire in the Town of Parker. E-1102 moved up for District coverage (River Island Market is the half way point between stations 11 and 211). E-2203 arrived to find a fully involved approximately 30' RV fire that had been abandoned. Parker FD canceled Buckskin FD.

Administration: The Board approved to clean up our County accounts by transferring funds from accounts that we no longer need to match our year end balances for FY 18/19 and to make current of other Reserve accounts balances.

June 6, I attended a meeting with the fire chiefs from Parker and Bouse to discuss mutual aid and cooperative efforts.

We have implemented a new computer software program (Crew Sense) that electronically tracks and processes crew scheduling. This will greatly limit human influences and creates transparency and equality.

In our electronic incident reporting system, we have set up a new data collection field to assist us in having factual information on how many non-taxpayers we are responding to. In the future, this information will be used to determine if the Fire Board wishes to bill non-taxpayers for our services. It is my recommendation that we collect this data for this fiscal year before we make a decision to bill for services.

We are working on a "lessons learned" document from our unfortunate boating incident. This will lead to the development of a written boat operations procedure.

June 25<sup>th</sup>, met with leaders from the Parker Fire District, per their request, to discuss possible partnerships including Joint Management Agreements (JMA), mergers and consolidations. The Parker Fire Board has requested my attendance at a Fire Board work session on July 3<sup>rd</sup>, to educate them on Joint Management Agreements (JMA), mergers and consolidations. I will email all of you a copy of our PowerPoint that was created for this presentation.

June 26<sup>th</sup>, met with Arizona Deputy Fire Marshall to discuss La Paz County's setback variances from 5' to 3'. He and I agree that we do not support these variances and are developing a letter to La Paz County supporting Community Development's recommendation not to allow these variances.



Barbara Cole, Lieutenant Foerstner and myself will be the 2019 Arizona Fire Service Leadership Conference (ADFA summer conference) in Glendale, AZ July 8<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup>.

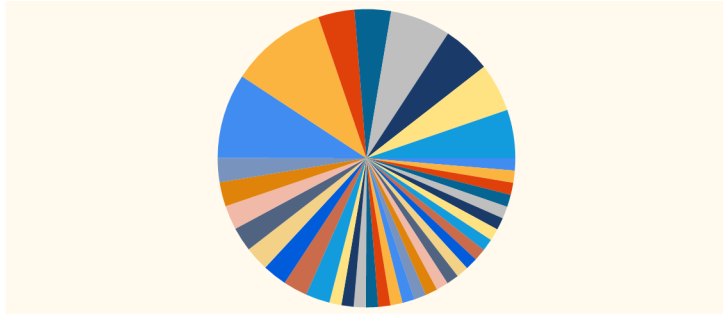
