Also, Chief Maloney had explained the insurance company had paid for the cost of the repairs on the original boat and that they gave the original boat back to the Buckskin Fire District, and when a decision was made on what boat would be purchased, and would come back to the Fire Board for a decision on how to dispose of the original boat, either through public auction, as an example, or as a trade in. There was no motion necessary as there were no decisions to be made at this time.

## Chief's Monthly Report - August 2019

Troy Maloney, Fire Chief

<u>Personnel:</u> All are doing well. We have one employee out on Industrial Leave.

<u>Apparatus</u>: Boat-1 is out of service. We are still using the borrowed jet boat from the Sheriff's Office. The insurance company settlement was \$92,000; we have accepted their offer and received a check in the full amount which was deposited into our apparatus replacement fund account.

Inter-Governmental Agreement (IGA) with Arizona State Parks for the purchase of a new boat has been signed. Once we decide on a new boat and purchase it, the State will reimburse us \$225,000.

New boat quotes are all in and being analyzed line by line by our apparatus committee for a recommendation. The committee's report will be included in your upcoming Fire Board packets in October.

<u>Facilities:</u> We are continuing to make station repairs as finances allow. Swamp coolers at station 11 has been rebuilt.

Station 211 overhead door had hinges that were broken/cracked and had to be replaced. These doors are 12 years old.

Station 11 evaporation coolers have been rebuilt.

<u>Incidents:</u> August 5<sup>th</sup> at 16:36 hours, E-1101, E-1102 and T-1131 responded to a tractor-trailer fire containing hazardous materials on Hwy-95 near MM-157. E-1102

arrived to find a trailer containing corrosives with a break fire. The driver had disconnected the tractor from the trailer and moved it away from the fire. The fire was extinguished without damage to the trailer or product.

August 10<sup>th</sup> at 16:04 hours, E-1102 and E-1101 responded to the boat ramp at Havasu Springs Resort to meet Mohave County Sheriff's boat with a patient with a femur fracture. E-1102 took patient care with assistance from E-1101. Patient was transported by AMR to Havasu Regional hospital.

August 10<sup>th</sup> at 17:05 hours, E-1101 and E-1102 responded to the dock in the Keys for a patient who had dived into the canal, lacerated their head, loss consciousness and was unable to move or feel extremities. The patient was extricated to the dock by his friends and family. E-1101 and E-1102 arrived and took patient care. PT transported to the landing pad at LPRH by AMR and was flown to a trauma center in Las Vegas.

August 18<sup>th</sup> at 17:22 hours, E-1101, E-1102 and C-1100 responded to a car that had crashed through the wall of a house with a person trapped. E-1101 and C-1100 arrived to find the driver trapped inside the vehicle with heavy damage to the building and vehicle. C-1100 took command of the incident at checked the stability of the structure while E-1101 took patient care. After removing debris within the house, the patient was extricated through the driver's door. The patient had minor injuries and refused treat. The scene was left with La Paz County Sheriff's.

August 21<sup>st</sup> at 18:28 hours, E-1101, E-1102 and C-1100 responded to a vehicle that had drove off of the cliff in the area of the Moovalya Keys and rolled to the bottom with two occupants in it. E-1101 and C-1100 arrived to find two patients with minor injuries. The vehicle had major damage to it and had rolled several times. E-1101 took patient care. Both patients refused treatment/transport. E-1102 and AMR were canceled. The scene was turned over to the Paz County Sheriff's Office.

<u>Administration:</u> We have been working on completing annual employee performance evaluations.

August 6<sup>th</sup>, I was invited to the Parker Town Council meeting to present an achievement award to one of their police officers for his assistance on the structure fire at the Eagles building where this officer quickly evacuated the structure.

August 7<sup>th</sup>, met with the La Paz County Community Development Director to discuss residential side setback variances in our community.

August 9<sup>th</sup>, Barbara Cole and I met with two Parker Fire Board members to review Parker's FY18/19 year-end financial statements.

August 14<sup>th</sup>, met with Arizona State Senator Borrelli and Supervisor Minor for a tour of station 11 and discussion about future funding.

August 15<sup>th</sup>, had a phone discussion with the James Vincent Group (JVG) about the possibility of the Fire Board requesting a feasibility study.

August 29<sup>th</sup>, on-duty crews and myself attended a mass-casualty incident tabletop exercise. Over 30 people from La Paz and Mohave Counties representing 11 different agencies attended.

Working with the Parker Fire Chief to set up a "townhall" type meeting for questions & answers with the public to be held in September at the Parker Senior Center. Date and time TBA.


