## Chief's Monthly Report - September 2020

Troy Maloney, Fire Chief

Personnel: All are doing well.

The in-house, State certified Firefighter-1&2 class at station 22 is still going well.

Drews are back from the wildland assignment in northern California/Oregon.

<u>Apparatus:</u> 2221 is out of service and in Phoenix for repairs. 2202 and 2251 are listed on Brindlee Mountain Fire Apparatus, LLC for sale.

2231 is in service, but only as a water tender; no pump. (next apparatus to go in for repairs)

1102 has returned from a wildland fire assignment in Northern California.

All other apparatus is in service.

Facilities: No major issues or repairs.

Swap Coolers in the bays at station 11 are rusted out and need replacing; getting guotes.

<u>Incidents:</u> Sept 5<sup>th</sup> at 17:13 hours, Boat-1, 1102 and 1151 responded to a boating accident in front of River Lodge Resort. Boat-1 arrived with SBCSO and LPCSO boats to find a single victim of a prop chop with severe injuries. 1151 took command of the incident, Boat-1 took patient care with assistance from 1102. A medical helicopter was requested. AMR transported the patient to a landing zone with the patient was flown top West Valley in critical condition.

Sept 8<sup>th</sup> at 17:04 hours, Brush-11 responded mutual aid to Ehrenburg for a brush fire. Brush -11 arrived to find approximately 15 acres burning near Gilligan's Island. Ehrenburg Fire District was on scene and has command of the incident. Brush-11 performed fire suppression through direct attack. The fire was extinguished at 20:47 hours.

Sept 10<sup>th</sup> at 14:00 hours,1102 deployed to a wildland fire assignment in California with Captain Weatherford as the Engine Boss and FF Kowalski as the Engine Boss Trainee. They have been assigned to the Slater Fire in Happy Camp. Station 211 crews are running out of Reserve Engine 1103.

The Slater Fire started during the night of September 7, near Slater Butte Fire Lookout on the Klamath National Forest. It is currently burning on the Klamath, Six Rivers, and Rogue-Siskiyou National Forests in Siskiyou and Del Norte Counties in California and Josephine County in Oregon. Road closure and evacuations are in place due to the Slater Fire. As of 7 a.m. September 10, 2020 the Slater Fire has grown to an estimated 136,314 acres and is 0% contained.

Sept 10<sup>th</sup> at 16:15 hours, 2201 and 2200 responded to a person trapped under a car on Kofa Ave. 2201 arrived to find the victim had self-extricated after a jack had failed and the car fell on top of them; the patient had minor injuries and refused treatment.

Sept 12<sup>th</sup> at 21:48 hours, 2201 and 2200 responded to a vehicle fire with an exposure to a building at Ruperto's Mexican restaurant. 2201 arrived a to find vehicle in the drive-thru lane with heavy fire from the engine compartment. 2201 took command and extinguished the fire with no damage to the structure. 2200 and CRIT FD were on scene.

Sept 14<sup>th</sup> at 14:02 hours, 2201, 2200, AMR and Parker PD responded to the parking area in from of the La Paz County Justice Court on Arizona Ave for a person exposed to a white power sustenance that was said to be Anthrax. 2201 arrived a dawned full PPE to perform Gross Decontamination to the victim, then of themselves. The victim was transported by AMR to LPRH for further evaluation. The incident is under investigation by the FBI and no further information is available. The FBI lab found the substance to be non-hazardous.

Sept 16<sup>th</sup> at 14:10 hours, 1101, 2201 and 1100 responded mutual aid to a structure fire in Blue Water Lagoon per the request of CRIT FD; all units were canceled en-route. CRIT FD was on scene with the fire under control.

Sept 17<sup>th</sup> at 03:40 hours, 2201, 1101, 1100 and CRIT FD responded to the reported of aa structure fire at El Sarape restaurant in Parker. 2201 and 1100 arrived to find the building full of smoke and smoke coming out the vents on the roof. 1100 took command of the incident and 2201 made an interior fire attack. The cause of the fire was due to "careless cooking" and contained to the stove area. C RIT arrived and assisted with positive pressure ventilations to clear the smoke out of the building.1101 was canceled upon their arrival.

Sept 19<sup>th</sup> at 15:28 hours, Boat-1, 1102 and 1100 responded to the Buckskin State Park for a Prop Chop. 1102 and 1100 arrived to find the patient located in a vehicle with deep lacerations to both lower extremities and in stable condition; 1102 too patient care. 1100 took command and canceled Boat-1. Patient was transported to LPRH by AMR.

Sept 19<sup>th</sup> at 16:10 hours, 2201 and 2200 responded mutual aid for CRIT FD to Hwy-95 at MP 136 for a head-on accident with an AMR ambulance involved. 2201 and 2200 arrived to find CRIT FD on scene with one critical patient that required extrication located in the passenger vehicle and three moderate condition patients in the AMR unit. 2200 took command of the incident and requested a helicopter to the scene and requested 2203 to respond to assisted with extrication. 2201 and 2203 assisted CRIT FD with patient care and extrication. The critical patient was flown to West Valley Hospital (Level-1 Trauma Center) in Goodyear and the other three patients were ground transported by another AMR unit to La Paz Regional Hospital in stable condition.

Sept 23<sup>rd</sup> at 18:10 hours, 1102, 1101 and 1100 responded to the report of a brush fire in Hillcrest Bay. 1102 arrived to find two structures burning with exposure to five other homes. One home was 75% involved in fire and the other was 25% with heavy flame impingent to the other involved

structure. 1102 upgraded the incident to a working structure fire and made an offensive attack. 1101 stopped at station 211, split their crew and responded both 1101 and 1132. An off-duty BFD Captain responded to station 11 and brought 1131 to the scene.

1100 arrived on scene and took command of the incident requesting an engine from Parker, a tender from CRIT and an engine form Lake Havasu City FD; CRIT did not have a tender available but did provided District coverage for Parker. coverage. 1100 was advised by bystanders that there was a person with severe burns. 1100 made contact with the patient and requested AMR to respond and put a medical helicopter on standby; AMR took patient care when they arrived. The patient was in stable condition with burns to hands and legs.

1101 arrived and made entry into the building that had been 25% involved but was having rapid fire spread. 1101 made and interior attack, but due to a roof collapse, all crews had to evacuate the structure and go into a defensive attack. 2201, 2203, two engines from Lake Havasu City & a Battalion Chief and an engine from Desert Hills assisted in protecting the surroundings structures and held the fire to the two original structures. Lack of water supply was a major issue in this event. Water had to be shuttled from Havasu Springs Report. The exposures to the west sustained heavy damage to a boat and several PWCs and minor damage to a garage. A total of two homes were destroyed.

Incident Command was terminated at 03:00 hours. 1132 remained on scene for Fire Watch throughout the night. The cause if the fire was accidental and due to a gasoline explosion in a garage of the structure of origin.

<u>Administration:</u> The Bouse Fire District voted by Resolution to request Consolidation into the Parker Fire District. This will be on PFD's agenda for discussion and possible action next month.

We applied for grants for BFD and PFD through the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) for firefighting foam.

We are working on the PFD proposed annexation of the Parker South area.

Sept 23<sup>rd</sup>, met with Town of Parker Community development Director and AZ State Fire Marshall to discuss the non-compliance issues at Sako Recycling on fiesta Ave.

Sept 30<sup>th</sup> at 12:00 Noon, Senator Borrelli, Representative Biasiucci, State Park & Trails Director Broscheid & Assistant Director Cook, Supervisor Minor, Sheriff Risen, BFD Fire Board members Rountree & Mihelich and leadership from the San Bernardino Sheriffs Department and Fire District were at station 11 for the dedication of Boat-1. It was a great success

Working on the audit for BFD. PFD's audit has been completed.


