A Public meeting of the Buckskin Fire Board convened on July 20, 2021, that started at 6:00 pm in the classroom of the Buckskin Fire District, located at: 8500 Riverside Drive, Parker, AZ 85344 that convened at 6:00 pm. The following matters were discussed at the Open Meeting

3. **Call to the Public.** Consideration and discussion of comments from the public. *Those wishing to address the Buckskin Fire District Board need not request permission in advance Pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431.01(G), the Fire District Board is not permitted to discuss or take any action on items raised in the call to the public that is not specifically identified on the Agenda. However, individual Board members may be permitted to respond to criticism directed to them. Otherwise, the Board may direct that staff review the matter or ask that the matter be placed on a future agenda. Public input is limited to two (2) minutes per session unless a greater amount of time is approved by the Board. **The Fire District Board cannot discuss or take legal action on any issue raised during the Call to the Public that is not on the current Agenda; due to restrictions of the Open Meeting Law.***

4. Approval of Minutes submitted for the Open Meetings held on July 20, 2021.
Motion made by Wayne Posey for the approval of Minutes for the meeting of 06/22/20201, except with a few changes regarding corrections and additions for clarity and transparency, along with a second from Jeff Daniel.

5. (Action Item): Discussion and Possible Action: Acceptance of monthly expense report 06/01/21 – 06/30/21. All transactions approved by Administrative Fire Chief; documentation for these expenses were reviewed and authorized by a minimum of two Fire Board Members whose signatures are on the warrants issued to vendor(s), as per Buckskin Fire District policy and procedures. *Board member Posey asked a few questions regarding the P & L regarding specific accounts and allocations for Parker Fire's separate P & L, which was answered by Barbara Cole. A couple of other questions were asked about the Wildland P & L. Motion was made by Jeff Daniel to approve the monthly financial reports and expense reports for 06/01/2021-06/30/21, along with a second from John Mihelich.*

Chairman Daniel: Motion passed by a unanimous vote on agenda item #5.
6. (Discussion and Possible Action): Discussion regarding fee schedules and Fire Recovery for patient billing. *Chairman Daniel turned the conversation over to the Chief, of which he explained our billing patients that are not District taxpayers, and how difficult is to get all the information. The billing company, Fire Recovery, charges a fee of \$30 even if they don't collect anything for medical calls, of which the District can't afford. He also stated that BFD continues to try to bill for the calls that they run on that are not in District residents and that we did just receive a check for \$348, but that is rare, but the District will continue billing what they can. There was no action necessary, as it was for informational only and an update for the Board.*
7. (Discussion and Possible Action): Discussion regarding Wildland compensation for Fire Fighters. *For the Wildland Firefighters that go out on the Fires in District and out of District regarding being properly compensated and to do profit sharing as we already set a precedent of a bit more than 50% over with Parker IGA. Wayne Posey suggested a profit sharing at end of fiscal year and put 1/2 of profits into a 457-retirement account that would not affect the PSPRS liability based on the total hours each worked on Wildland for the Fiscal year-end, from July 2020 through June 2021 that gets paid out once per year, and if you leave before the fiscal year end, you do not qualify for career only. At the beginning of the fiscal year, each employee would get bonused based on their hours and percentage into a 457 plan, of which is there money, to assist in their retirement and provide them with an incentive for going out. The whole point is a 50/50 split as they are doing the work and fighting this fire, and that would a reasonable offer. Chief spoke that he felt that it was a reasonable offer but wanted to make sure that the men were content*



with what was offered and whatever is decided needs to be put in a policy. Don Rountree commented that he liked the proposal, but 457 retirement plans have a limit of what can be put into it per year. There were several of the Wildland firefighters in the room that felt that this was generous, but they would rather see any kind of a bonus as a form of a check and have the decision to be able to put into a retirement account if they chose as they do side work that could be done instead of Wildland, for extra money. Mr. Posey asked if it could be structured as a onetime bonus program that does not affect PSPRS, Chief Maloney stated he would check on that to make sure that it can be non-pensionable. Mr. Posey stated if you pay it as payroll, you are only going to get it half as the other half goes to PSPRS, where you count it as a bonus you are going to get it at 100% instead of 50%. The discussion was to come back to the table next meeting and have the firemen look at different ways that the firefighters could be compensated and still achieve the same profit sharing. John, Mihelich suggested that they make it 24 hours immediately and we can amend it later, so if they go out immediately, we have taken care of them, while they are out there, they should be paid for it. Chief, part of the discussion is that Mohave Valley is paying at 1.75, so let me make sure what you are looking at, to pay them straight 24 for every day they are gone, including travel time and the extra money we try to put it into a bonus and not pensionable. Also, Mohave Valley pays them one step over their normal rate. Chief stated his recommendation, whatever it is, vote upon it and we will figure it out for the next meeting, but we must keep moving forward as we are at a standstill on two different concepts. But before you do that, do you guys have a preference? Captain Weatherford stated that his preference was to do the Mohave Valley way but as bonus that is not pensionable. that way we are not paying extra into PSPRS or costing more down the road. Motion made by Wayne Posey for Barbara to do a spreadsheet to show a calculation based on 50% of profit from the Wildland P & L, based off the total hours on each individual fire outside of the District and bring back to the board, and also have the firefighters come up a plan that they would like to see with the cost and the board can retroactive whatever decision is made, along with a second from Jeff Daniel.

8. (Discussion and Possible Action): Discussion regarding PSPRS Local Pension Board. Discussions ensued regarding the PSPRS pension debt and how to resolve according to BFD's resolution that was created in 2019 on when and how to pay off the pension debt to



PSPRS, as stated in the policy by 2037. Every year the percentage amount goes up for the Fire District to pay due to amount of debt. Discussions included what the PSPRS modeler showed that was part of a prior meeting, and what throwing small amounts of money does or does not do, besides what is paid in by payroll. Mr. Posey stated that his term had ran out on the Local Pension Board back in December and he recommended that Chairman Daniel appoint someone else to the board, as he has been on this for 2 terms and didn't feel like his voice had been heard, regarding paying down the pension debt. Chairman Daniel asked Don Rountree, who is the Secretary/Clerk, to be take his place. Mr. Rountree stated he would, but would like to see a plan, which could involve having outside professionals come in and speak to the Board members on what kind of solutions are available for Fire Districts to be able to have to help pay down the PSPRS debt sooner. The only action taken was for the Chairman to ask and appoint Don Rountree to the position of Chairman for the local pension board, no other action necessary.

Chief's Monthly Report - June 2021

Troy Maloney, Fire Chief

Personnel: All other personnel are doing well.

We had extra staffing for the 4th of July holiday weekend at stations 11, 211 & 22.

Apparatus: 2231 is out of service and in Phoenix for repairs.

Facilities: We have received bids for replacing the evaporative coolers at station 11 and placing them with 18 Seer high efficiency mini splits. This will be a Capital project request out of our Building Fund and will be presented to the Fire Board for approval.

Castle Rock Shores donated two new Weber grills to BFD.

Incidents: BFD Wildland Type-3 engine 1102 was deployed to the Telegraph Fire on the Tonto National Forest five miles southeast of Superior, AZ. Extreme fire behavior with uphill runs, flanking, spotting and torching. Numerous structures and energy infrastructure threatened. Evacuations, area, road, and trail closures in effect. This fire is 85,901 acres and growing with an estimated containment date of June 30th. Captain Weatherford was the Engine Boss with Firefighters Foster, Rather and POC Morgan.

June 9th at 09:16 hours, Boat-1 and 1100 responded to a boat fire on front of Branson's Resort. 1100 arrived to find a fully involved boat fire adrift and floating to a dock with other boats tied to it; 1100 took command of the incident. Boat-1 arrived and attacked the fire and used the fire water stream to push the boat to the shore, no damage to the dock area. 1100 checked the area to find five victims from the boat fire/explosion; 1100 requested 1102 and two ambulances to respond to the beach at Branson's Resort. 1100 put two medical helicopters on stand-by for two pediatric patients with burn injuries. One adult had head trauma, burns and a leg fracture and was transported by ground to Havasu Regional Hospital. The other adult had a leg fracture and minor burns. One patient refused treatment/transport. 1102 took patient care with assistance from AMR units. 1100 requested two helicopters to the scene to fly out the pediatric burn patients and one adult patient. 1100 set up a landing zone at the La Paz County Parks where both Care Flight-2 and Native Air-6 landed. The burn victims and two adults were flown to Maricopa Burn Center in Phoenix in stable condition. The scene is under investigation of the La Paz County Sheriff's Office.

June 9th at 15:17 hours, 1102, 1101 and 1100 responded to a car fire on HWY-95 near Castle Rock Shores. 1102 arrived to find a fully involved pick-up truck with all occupants out of the vehicle and uninjured. 1102 started fire attack and passed command to 1100. 1100 arrived, took command, and assisted La Paz Sheriff with traffic control. 1101 arrived and provided water to 1102. The fire was extinguished with 2000 gallons of water. The scene was turned over to DPS.

June 11, 2021, at 13:38 hours, Boat-1 and 1100 responded to a boat fire/explosion with injuries at River Shore Resort. 1100 notified CRIT that this incident was in their jurisdiction and that Buckskin units were responding. 1100 put a medical helicopter on stand-by. Boat-1 arrived to find the fire out and a single patient in critical condition. Boat-1 requested the helicopter to the scene and 1100 would be the Landing Zone contact. AMR arrived and assisted Boat-1 with patient care. Due to estimated time of arrival on scene for medical helicopter, the patient was transported by ground to the helipad at La Paz Regional Hospital with a paramedic from Buckskin Fire providing patient care in the AMR unit. The incident is under investigation of the San Bernadino County Sheriff's Office. The patient died from their injuries at LPRH.

June 14th, 2021, at 10:18 hours, 1101/1131 (one person on each), 1102 and 1100 were dispatched to a "unknown type fire" across the highway from the Havasu Springs Resort. A dark column of smoke could be seen from station 11; 1100 requested mutual aid from Parker FD and to have station 22 covered with Call-Back personnel. 1100 arrived to find a large fifth wheel RV fully involved in fire with exposures to multiple propane tanks, oxygen/acetylene tanks and overhead electrical power lines; 1100 took command and declared a working incident and in Defensive mode due to a propane fire. BFD units arrived to extinguish the fire with 4000 gallons of water via a master stream and handline. Firefighters search the area for possible victims; none found. APS was requested to the scene to secure electrical hazards. 2201 was directed to stage at station 11 for District coverage. No injuries were reported. All units cleared. The cause of the fire was undetermined, and the RV was a total loss.

June 14th at 19:04 hours, 2201, 2200, 1101 and CRIT FD responded to a fully involved structure fire at 505 S. Kofa Ave. 2201 arrived to find an un-occupied singlewide mobile home on fire with exposures to power lines and doublewide trailer. 2201 attacked the fire with assistance from CRIT. 2200 took command of the incident and cancelled 1101. The structure was a total loss. No damage to the exposures. The cause of the fire was suspicious and under investigation by Parker PD.

June 16th at 20:01 hours, Boat-1, 1102 and 1100 responded to a possible drowning in front of the La Paz County Sheriff's Boat House. Boat-1 arrived to find the victim had been removed from the water by a by-stander who found the victim floating down the river and in obvious distress. Boat-1 took patient care; patient ended up refusing treatment and was turned over to the La Paz County Sheriff's Office.

June 23rd at 19:04 hours 2201, 2203, 1102 and 2200 responded to a mobile home fire located at 505 S Kofa. 2201 arrived to find a fully involved mobile home with exposure to two other mobile homes. 2201 made a direct attack on the fire. CRIT arrived and assisted with fire attack. 2200 arrived and took command of the incident. The home was stated by neighbors not to be occupied. 2203 supplied water to 2201 from a hydrant located a block away. Command canceled 1102. The fire was extinguished with approximately 4000 gallons of water and no damage to the exposures. The fire is ruled suspicious, but no cause for the fire was found. The scene was turned over to Parker PD. All units cleared.

June 24th at 03:10 hours this morning, 1102, 1101 and 1100 responded to a reported wildland fire off Planet Ranch Road. 1102 and 1101 staged at the intersection off Hwy-95 and Planet Ranch Road

while 1100 scouted the area to find approximately a ¼ acre actively burning in a Bill Williams Refuge area approximately 2 miles off the highway and a ½ mile off Planet Ranch Road; The fire was named the "Planet Ranch Fire". BFD notified BLM and Arizona Game & Fish; this fire grew to 1,260 acres.

June 27, 2021, at 12:40 hours, 1101, 1132, 1100 and 2201 responded to the report of a structure fire with a person inside "behind The Bar at Riverside and Hwy-95". 1100 arrived at 10175 Marina Way to find a working fire in a doublewide mobile home with a large porch attached; 1100 took command of the incident and confirmed that everyone was out of the house and accounted for. 1101 arrived and made an interior attack to be pushed out by excessive heat and flames; fire was declared Defensive. 2201 arrived and supplied water to 1101. 1132 arrived and supplied water to 2201 and brought their crew forward to assist in the fire attack. Three off-duty BFD employees came in on Call-Back and assisted with fire attack, salvage, and overhaul. The cause of the fire was found to be an electrical wiring malfunction. APS was on-scene and discounted the electrical. LPCSO and Parker PD were on scene to assist with witness statements and traffic control. Crews made a great attack and extinguished the fire without the owner/occupant losing all their belongings, however the structure will be totaled. Crews salvaged items of concern for the owner/occupant. There was no damage to exposures and no injuries were reported.

June 29th at 11:00 hours, BFD's Type-3 Engine deployed to the Sky Fire north of Chico California with Captain Weatherford as the Engine Boss and Firefighters Rather and Foster. The high temperatures, low relative humidity, and low moisture in that dense vegetation. Our crew was re-assigned to Sky Fire, Bradley Fire, and the Beckwourth Complex Fire in Northern California. Our crew returned home on July 16th.

2021 Parker Tube Float was held Saturday June 12th; BFD had extra staffing on for this event. The event was very successful with a record low call volume. San Bernardino County Fire District assisted BFD with a fire boat for this event.

Administration: We are gathering signatures for the Parker South annexation. The 2021 AFCA/AFDA Conference was held in Glendale, AZ on July 5-8, 2021.

June 2nd, I attended a conference call with the US Coast Guard regarding the 2021 Parker Tube Float.

June 2nd, the Arizona State Fire Marshall met with me to discuss our fire inspection programs for both Districts.

June 3rd, met with the Town of Parker Community Development and the Owners of Environmental Waste Solutions regarding a new business in Parker South.

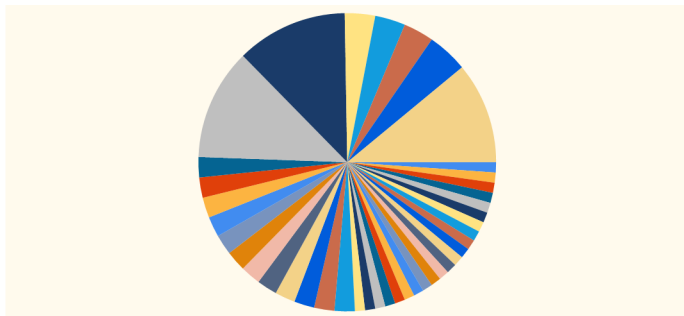
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Count of Incidents by Incident Type per Zone
